

PATO BRANCO



In 1990, the Federal Government founded the Federal Center of Technological Education (Centro Federal de Educação Tecnológica - Cefet-PR) – Pato Branco unit.

At this time, the unit consisted of 22 professors, 57 administrative staff and only 442 students.

In 2005, the most outstanding change happened: CEFET was transformed into the FEDERAL UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY – PARANÁ – UTFPR, the first one specialized in Brazil.

From then on, the Pato Branco Campus started to offer Technical High School Education, in land surveying area.

In 2007, the first Engineering courses and Graduation extension started. Besides these new courses, in the same year, the Agronomy Graduate Program was conceived, being the first of the campus and the region.

In 2008, 44 semiannual and annual vacancies and new bachelors and graduation courses were developed. Furthermore, in this same year, the Regional Development Graduate Program and the Electrical Engineering Graduate Program were approved by CAPES.

In the following years, Chemical Technology and Graduate Program of Biochemical Processes, Professional Masters in Mathematics in National Network and the Agronomy Graduate Program started.

These days, the Pato Branco campus consists of 89 administrative staff, 304 teacher and more than 3000 students.

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
